Following the Christ's injunction, Saul entered Damascus. For three days he neither ate nor drank, and he prayed vigorously (9:9,11). It is sometimes alleged that Saul's prayers were the means of his salvation. Again, however, this conflicts with Paul's later testimony. The preacher sent by Jesus commanded: "And now, why do you wait?
