If a flower has sepals, petals, pistils, and stamens, it is a complete flower. If a flower is missing one of those, it is an incomplete flower. Imperfect flowers are always incomplete, but incomplete flowers may or may not be imperfect. Plants may be classified as monoecious or dioecious.

Besides petals, most flowers have a stamen, a pistil and sepals. If a flower has all four of these parts, botanists consider it "complete." A rose, for example, is a complete flower. If one of these parts is missing, the flower is called "incomplete."
